# Dear parents,

Happy February! With this box, we're covering two important days: Valentines Day (Feb. 14th) and Ash Wednesday (Feb. 17th). The objective of the contents provided here is to help you talk about these days as a family and celebrate them together in your home.

Valentines Day certainly has become commercialized, but it can still serve as a wonderful opportunity to talk with your kids about Jesus' great love and how it is important to share that love with our friends, so they can know Jesus too. The Valentine coloring sheet provides some background on who Saint Valentine was, and why we celebrate this day today. Try asking your children to come up with some ways they can share God's love with others on days besides Valentines Day (bonus points if you actually go out and do some of the things they come up with)!

Ash Wednesday has a little bit of a more somber tone than the love-filled holiday that precedes it. This day marks the start of the season in the church year called "Lent" in which we focus on our sinful nature and our deep need for the forgiveness and salvation won for us on the cross. On Ash Wednesday, many people put ashes or dust on their foreheads as a reminder that when God created mankind, he formed him out of dirty dust, like ash, and someday our bodies will die and we will become "dust" again -- but the ash that we put on our foreheads is in the shape of a *cross* to remind us that the story doesn't end when our bodies die. Because of Jesus' death on the cross and resurrection from the tomb, we get to live again! Death can be a tricky topic to discuss with your children -- but it's an important one. Emphasize that the focus of Lent is sin and death, and that it's okay to be sad about that, but that we always have the joyful hope of Easter morning! It's totally natural for your kids to have questions about death and life after death, so if you need help navigating those difficult conversations please don't hesitate to reach out and we'll get you connected with some age-appropriate resources.

I strongly encourage you to attend Ash Wednesday worship here with us on Feb. 10th at 11am or 7pm. Your family can receive the imposition of ashes in the Sanctuary, or from the comfort and safety of your vehicle via our "drive-in" service option. If you aren't able to come in person, watch the livestream and use the time of the imposition of ashes to discuss what's happening on screen. Read through the materials in this box, and do the Project together as a family (see reverse) to guide your conversations.

As always, I pray that these materials serve you well. I look forward to seeing all of your beautiful Alleluias returned so they can be displayed in the Sanctuary on Easter morning (but keep that part to yourself, so we can surprise the children!)
