Goals of 2023

Board of Education & Board of Youth

- ⇒ Once a quarter have organized opportunities for minors to participate more actively in worship. Examples include: singing, collecting offerings, ushering, greeting, and reading.
- ⇒ Develop a plan to expand midweek by the Fall of 2023 by surveying parents, finding volunteers, and choosing a curriculum.
- ⇒ Provide weekly resources and opportunities for devotions and prayer time at home. Examples: CPH Growing in Christ worship bulletin, Visual Faith Ministry handouts, kids in divine worship, advent/lent devotions.
- ⇒ Create 2 milestone events for 9th grade and up that would recognize life events such as graduation (Mid May) from High school, trade school, and college, engagements, first job, and driver's license (key chain with confirmation verse on it), and military service, retirement (1st of the new year), 1st year of marriage.
- ⇒ Create a cradle roll program for families with children ages 0-3 to create a touchpoint for families at least twice a year.

Wednesday Night—PreK through 12th Grade

Every Wednesday night late August through early May, starting at 5:30 PM, the church doors are open to families for dinner, with parent supervision until classes start. There will be music practice, class and games. PreK—5th grade (Midweek) dive into Preconfirmation lessons. 6th-8th grade (Confirmation) cover the Catechism and Highschool (LYF) learn how to apply Biblical principles to their lives. Parent's Role

"Parents remain the number one person who impacts the faith lives of young people. Nearly 3 in 4 young adults (72%) listed at least one parent as one of the most influential people in their lives. While that influence was usually positive, those who left the LCMS were more than twice as likely to say a parent had a negative influence (13% vs 5%).

Today's Active LCMS young adults were the most likely to see high levels of faith practiced by their parents. This included frequent Bible reading at home, praying as a family, regular church attendance of both parents together (continuing even today), and at least one parent having a service or leadership role in the church. Of all the other profiles, parents of Nominal LCMS are least likely to be leaders in the church, read the Bible with their children and attend worship regularly now or in the past. When parents don't prioritize worship and congregational engagement, young people won't either.

Today's Active LCMS were also the most likely to report having a good relationship with parents in high school. They related well with parents in general, specially with dad. They felt they could talk to both parents about life issues and could talk openly with at least one parent about faith. They felt safe bringing up their questions and doubts to their parents. When parents are open to tough conversations about life and faith, young people are more likely to stay in church."

Guidelines

Expectations

Everyone is expected to be punctual, prepared and ready to learn. 2nd grade and up are expected to bring an ESV (English Standard Version) Bible to class. Confirmands are expected to bring The Story and Luther's Small Catechisms to Confirmation. Bibles and Catechisms are handed out to families at Back 2 School Bash in August.

Drop off & Pick Up Procedures

Make sure to sign you child in and out after every class using our tablet. Sunday School's check in is by the choir room and on Wednesday nights it is located by the gym.

Advent & Lent

During these seasons of the church year on Wednesday nights dinner will be served prior to our regular activities starting at 5:45PM. This is dinner for your family to enjoy and spend time together. Do not drop your child off for dinner without accompanying them. There will be a worship service after regular activities. We believe that worship is an important part of a family's life and we encourage families to participate in worship together.

Assignments and Memory Work

Confirmation students will be assigned homework to do at home with their parents. There is also a memory verse challenge that anyone can participate in. You will find more information on the "Memory Work" page.

Music Opportunities

On Wednesdays practice for PreK—5th grade choir and 6th grade through adults beginners bell choir will be available. Ability to participate in performances will be dictated by attendance at practices.

Attendance

Worship and class attendance is essential to the spiritual life of every Christian. Therefore we expect our youth and parents to participate in weekly worship and Bible Study for the strengthening of faith. Regular attendance is essential for the learning process, continuity of the class plus modeling behavior and values as mentioned in the "Parent's Roles". Attendance in worship and class is a requirement to be confirmed.

Discipline

Our youth are expected to respect each other and their surroundings. Each teacher has a different way of handling disciplinary issues in his/her classroom. If a teacher feels it is necessary for further disciplinary action DCE Smith will be notified. DCE Smith will have a face to face conversation with the adult picking up the minor about the behavior exhibited and actions taken.

Weather Cancellations

If there is a cancelation of any type parents are to watch their emails or Holy Cross's Facebook page for updates. Decisions will be made between called staff and issued 2 hours ahead of time if able.

Parent Participation

As a parent, please fervently pray for your child, the youth of your congregation, your called staff, teachers and our church. Ask your child about what he/she is learning and share your thoughts with them. Any parent who wants to volunteer is welcomed to do so. All volunteers are required to go through a background check and training beforehand. In Confirmation classes parental attendance is required for all 100 level and optional for level 200.
