

Generosity & Giving

ow that fall is just around the corner, it's that time of year when we are invited to think more about generosity and giving. The landscape and demographics of Holy Cross have been changing. Our core membership appears to be trending younger with proportionally more children in worship since 2019, and thereby more families too. What might the future hold for generosity and giving?

The Barna Group is an evangelical Christian polling firm based here in the US, and it has been busy gathering data and information for years. Recently, they have completed a multi-volume work called *The State of Generosity*, which looks more closely at generosity and stewardship, looking ahead to the future of generosity. Here are a couple of their most recent insights, as drawn from a recent publication entitled *A New Era of Giving*.




This first one is definitely shocking at first glance. There is a definite trend here and it appears that it doesn't bode well for the future of charitable giving. However, one must keep in mind some of the life experiences that each of these generations would be going through right now. Many Gen Zs may be in a situation where finances are especially tight, such as paying off student loans from college and/or graduate school. Gen Zs may also be at the beginning stages of raising a family, which immediately requires financial backing. Since the time of this survey, the situation has become financially even more difficult as of late with the inflation that our country has seen.

Meanwhile, the elders and boomers have already successfully navigated through these challenges while building up the resources, disciplines, and experiences to be in a position to give generously.

For the younger generations, it can be extremely beneficial to have a system of automatic withdrawal in place for the finances, so that a good pattern can be established early on that can be tweaked or modified later, rather than starting from scratch at a later point in life.

Though the data on financial giving is troubling, the report showed that Gen Z and Millennials are generous and give in other ways:



Here we see that Gen Z easily outpaces all other adults with regards to volunteering time, with over half of Gen Zs that responded to the survey having volunteered their time to an organization. This generation seems to seek out some practical and hands-on ways to share those things that God has given to them.

What is also encouraging about this graphic is that Gen Zs appear to be very financially conscious as well, planning and evaluating their finances more than any other generation ahead of them. This too is an encouraging sign, that they are even more aware of all the blessings that God has given them (whether or not they realize or acknowledge that it is in fact given by God). As this planning and evaluating continues, perhaps it will bring with it even more growth in generosity. ~ Pastor Gimbel Information in this article is drawn the following website. Monthly Music Minute for September 2023

A series in which the music director shares some thoughts about the music coming up in church this month

eptember is here! Summer is just about over, fall is beginning, and a new season of our life as a church is beginning. The first big mile marker for this season, at least for your church music director, is Holy Cross Day. Celebrated September 17th this year, it is a time for celebrating not just our founding and heritage as a congregation, but our founding and heritage as Christians — for it is on that cross that our place in eternity was secured.

In celebration of this day, we will be singing a newlycomposed hymn as our sermon hymn. The text, entitled "Covenantal Cross of Splendor," was written by my close friend, Vicar Joshua Teggatz. The text was chosen as the winner of the seminary's annual Prevallet hymn-writing competition. So, when he asked me to write the music for the text, I jumped at the chance. The text goes like this:

- 1) Covenantal cross of splendor, Gleaming portal of God's heart, Sign of grace for the offender, Canvas of love's highest art. Fullness of His words of old. Key of promises foretold.
- 2) Satan bruised the second Adam, Nailed Him to the cursed tree. But the Lamb of God, victorious, Crushed the serpent's jubilee. Second tree of plenteous fruit, Symbol of our substitute.
- 3) Through the promised seed of Abram, Heaven's gates stand open wide, Heralding sublime adoption To all who by faith abide. Portal of our Promised Land, Token of God's loving hand.
- 4) Jesus Christ, foretold Messiah, Broken in humility, Took our sin upon His shoulders, Answered our most desperate plea. Cross of reconciling love! Sign of favor from above!
- 5) Covenantal cross of splendor, Gleaming portal of God's heart, Sign of grace for the offender, Canvas of love's highest art. Final word of saving grace, On our heads the cross we trace.

I asked Josh to share a few thoughts on the text, its meaning, and his thought process on writing the hymn. He writes:

"The cross means a lot to us as Christians, Just as we see it in so many different places and behold so many different artistic depictions of it, so Scripture gives us several different lenses with which to examine the cross and to appreciate its beauty and significance for us as redeemed children of God. This text, "Covenantal Cross of Splendor," focuses on how the cross fulfills the promises and prophecies of God in the Old Testament and what that fulfillment means for the believer. It especially centers on the idea that God has always been a covenantal God who desires to be with His people and be their God. The cross is the site where this covenant is sealed and ratified with the very blood of Christ. This is the place where we see God revealed in all of His mercy, grace, and love. It is the battleground where Satan is defeated. It is the entrance into God's heavenly kingdom. It is the altar by which reconciliation and forgiveness are achieved. When we look at the cross, we are reminded of all these promises God has fulfilled for us in Jesus Christ, always looking at it with the glorious backdrop of Christ's Easter victory. It was a pleasure to collaborate with David on this hymn and I hope this text allows you to be brought once again to that covenantal cross of splendor."



B.A.S.I.C.S. (**Brief Adult Study In Christianity & Service**) As needed, this class is offered for those who wish to know more about Holy Cross and the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod. B.A.S.I.C.S. is open to anyone of high school age or older, both prospective and current members of the congregation. Those wishing to become members of Holy Cross are welcome to do so upon completion of B.A.S.I.C.S.

T.L.C. (Transfer for Lutherans Class)

Class is held on a group or individual basis as needed for those who desire to transfer their church membership from another Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod congregation to Holy Cross. The orientation introduces new members to the various ways they can get involved and serve in the congregation as members. A New Member Luncheon, sponsored by the Board of Evangelism, is held twice a year where new members are introduced to the congregation.

Everything from pre-taping to moving furniture out of the way to the actual painting was conducted during eight hours of work. A few volunteers even returned on Monday to help finish the job. What a great opportunity to provide hands-on service for one of the schools that we are supporting this year with our yearlong mission of Lutheran Schools.

As we look to the fall we are planning speakers from Lutheran High, Immanuel Wentzville, and Concordia Seminary in St. Louis. We will also be working together with the Stewardship Board to put together care packages for first-year seminary students as they enter finals week towards the end of the semester.
