State of the Church

ach year in January, the President of the United States shares his "State of the Union" address. Since we are in that same time frame, I would like to take an opportunity to likewise share a "State of Holy Cross."

Looking back at 2023, it will for better or worse, be one that will be marked by its challenges and transitions. The most impactful one was the departure of Pastor Meyer and his family to serve at Emmanuel - St. Michael Lutheran School in Fort Wayne, Indiana, this past summer. This transition seemed to be an unexpected and unpleasant surprise to many, and I have gotten the sense that we are still grieving his departure in many ways.

At the same time, however, it has been fun to see this congregation be so willing to help and adapt during this vacancy. A large part of the help during this vacancy is the return of our residential field education students from Concordia Seminary this fall: Vince Otto and his wife Dana, and Owen Duncan and his wife Evangeline. Each of these two families have been willing and able to jump right in and help, bringing with them all of the growth and learning from their respective vicarage internships.

I have also been grateful during this time of transition for all of the support given to me and to my family, from a little extra verbal encouragement to additional gestures of love and support. My wife, my children, and I are beyond grateful! Thank you!

Holy Cross was also affected by a second big transition following Darlene Birk's retirement as Preschool Director at the end of the last school year. She was the heart and soul of that ministry week in and week out, and we are so grateful for all of her faithful service in getting the message of Jesus to the children, their families, and even to the other staff members for so many years.

Unlike the pastoral vacancy, though, the preschool director position was filled this summer, and we welcomed Morgan Calcaterra into our midst as director, along with three new staff members. Thus far the ministry has gone well, and I look forward to see it continue to grow as the team works together this semester and, Lord-willing, into the future.

While we have certainly been in times of transition with those two key positions at Holy Cross, there have been many other wonderful things this year. I have received many wonderful comments about how many children and families there are - even more so it seems than before. In 2023 we leaned in on those things and expanded our Wednesday night midweek program. We added a beginning handbell choir consisting primarily of middle school and high school students as well as a children's choir. All of these new groups found success beyond what we expected! Even the number of children at the weekly children's talk remains strong and is even growing!

I cannot wait to see what 2024 has in store for us at Holy Cross. We have some wonderful opportunities in front of us--opportunities for God to continue to bring about change and growth. We look forward to see how God will provide for us through the call process and set our sights now on Call Day at the seminaries in late April. We look forward to the opportunities to think more seriously about а structure governance that better suits the dynamics of our congregation. We look forward to see how God can use another year of operating in the black and the surplus funds.

Most of all, we look forward once again to receiving God's gifts in the places where He has promised to be -- in His Word and Sacraments. I cannot wait to see what God has in store for us in 2024!

'e view our preschool program as a Christian outreach to families with young children. Our intent is to support, encourage and provide opportunities that enhance the educational process already present in your home. Our program provides an environment where young children can explore and learn about God, themselves, others, and the world around them in an atmosphere of Christian love and acceptance.

The Preschool program prepares students for Kindergarten and beyond by providing a balanced schedule of planned activities and play which develop the Missouri Early Learning Standards of Literacy, Science, Mathematics, Physical Development, Social/Emotional skills and Spiritual Development. Small group activities meet individual needs, and large group interaction encourages social cooperation. Learning centers build skills which lay the foundation for future reading and academic interests.

This core curriculum is taught during the Preschool class time for 4-year-old students on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays, 8:30-11:30AM or 12:30 - 3:30PM, and for the 3-yearold students on Tuesdays and Thursdays, 8:30 -11:30AM.

Once a Preschool class time is chosen, families may add times of Extended Education Mondays through Fridays 8AM - 5:30PM. Students have a structured schedule where they participate in activities to reinforce and enhance Preschool Curriculum including stories, art, centers, computer and games. Large motor activities are outside or in the gym. Students staying for lunch bring their own sack lunch.

Calling a Pastor

he Call Committee received the names of 7 candidates to consider from the two seminaries. The committee reviewed the profile of each candidate. They met on Sat., Jan. 13, to discuss their insights and decide who they wanted to interview in person. They have outlined their interview process and determined the questions for each candidate. They continue to be in contact with the placement director at each seminary.

Interviews: In-person interviews with each of the top candidates were set up for the end of January. Once those interviews are concluded and the committee has had the opportunity to pray and discuss the results, they will schedule a Special Voters Meeting to extend a call. [This could be as early as Sun., Feb. 11, so look for further notes in the weekly newsletter.]

Pray: Please remember that there will be more congregations requesting a candidate than there are candidates available. Therefore, this process does not guarantee that Holy Cross will receive an associate pastor. This work is still in God's hands.

Options: Voters will have an opportunity to extend an exclusive call for the one candidate the Call Committee feels best meets Holy Cross' needs, or a call ranking the top two or three candidates. In this second scenario, Holy Cross could receive its second or third choice if the first choice is assigned to another congregation. The Call Committee will be bringing a recommendation for which avenue to pursue once all the candidates have been interviewed.

Pray: Please continue to pray that God will lead and guide the interview process and those involved as the Call Committee works to accomplish His will for the ministry at Holy Cross.

Monthly Music Minute for January 2024

A series in which the music director shares some thoughts about the music coming up in church this month

appy Lent! Can you believe it? I certainly can't. It seems like we just finished Christmas, and we're already heading into the season of Lent. If it feels early to you as well, you're right; Easter is earlier than normal this year, falling at the end of March.

As we prepare for Lent, then, I'd like to share with you our theme for our Lenten midweek services this year. The series is entitled The Shadow and the Substance — How Old Testament Individuals Point to Christ. Each week as we look at a different character from the Old Testament, we will ponder specifically how this character's life and actions point to the events of Holy Week, of Christ on the

The series is based on a new hymn written by one of our seminary fieldworkers, Owen Duncan. The hymn is entitled "Before the Crowd the Most High God". I asked Owen to share some background about this hymn. He

"The hymn we are going to use during our Wednesday and Holy Week Lenten services this year is one that I wrote especially for this sermon series. A year or so ago, a friend of mine who was on his vicarage told me that his congregation was doing a sermon series about the types of Christ (figures in the Old

Testament who point us forward to Christ). He also said that they were having trouble finding a good hymn for the series, and he asked if I might be willing to write a hymn for them. Finding myself with a little time on my hands, I did.

This hymn, then, is about some of the figures in the Old Testament who point forward to Christ—Adam, Moses, David, Jonah, Noah, Joshua, Melchizedek, and Isaac—and how each of these figures points forward to Christ. I pray that throughout this series—and as you sing this hymn again and again—you might reflect on what the book of Hebrews reminds us of: that "In many and various ways God spoke to His people of old through the prophets, but now, in these last days, He has spoken to us through His Son." Rejoice this Lenten season over the fact that we have a God who has certainly not hidden Himself throughout the history of His people, but who has especially revealed Himself in His incarnation, when He came to this earth in human flesh and suffered and died—and rose to life—for you and for me."

It is my prayer this Lenten season that, as we sing this hymn each week and as we ponder all the different characters and stories of scripture, we may grow richer in the knowledge and promises of our God. I hope you will join us— Happy Lent! ~ David Gilson
