
The Shadow and the Substance: How Old Testament Individuals Point to Christ

MIDWEEK LENT THEME

The Lenten midweek series is entitled <u>The Shadow and the Substance — How Old Testament Individuals Point to Christ</u>. Each week as we look at a different character from the Old Testament, we will ponder specifically how this character's life and actions point to the events of Holy Week, of Christ on the cross.

The series is based on a new hymn written by one of our seminary fieldworkers, Owen Duncan. The hymn is entitled "Before the Crowd the Most High God". Owen shares some background about this hymn below.

"The hymn we are going to use during our Wednesday and Holy Week Lenten services this year is one that I wrote especially for this sermon series. A year or so ago, a friend of mine who was on his vicarage told me that his congregation was doing a sermon series about the types of Christ (figures in the Old Testament who point us forward to Christ). He also said that they were having trouble finding a good hymn for the series, and he asked if I might be willing to write a hymn for them. Finding myself with a little time on my hands, I did.

This hymn, then, is about some of the figures in the Old Testament who point forward to Christ and how each of these figures points forward to Christ. I pray that throughout this series—and as you sing this hymn again and again—you might reflect on what the book of Hebrews reminds us of: that "In many and various ways God spoke to His people of old through the prophets, but now, in these last days, He has spoken to us through His Son." Rejoice this Lenten season over the fact that we have a God who has certainly not hidden Himself throughout the history of His people, but who has especially revealed Himself in His incarnation, when He came to this earth in human flesh and suffered and died—and rose to life—for you and for me."

WEEKLY THEME: NOAH

This week we focus on Noah and events in his life that point us to Jesus. Read the words of the Duncan hymn carefully:

Once Noah built—when rains beset—a boat which God contrived; The waters drowned the world, and yet those in the ark survived.

So too behind a cross of wood we hide when storms arise; For Christ has made a promise good that here salvation lies.



READING: Genesis 6:9-22 Please sit

A reading from Genesis, chapter 6. L

> ⁹These are the generations of Noah. Noah was a righteous man, blameless in his generation. Noah walked with God. ¹⁰And Noah had three sons, Shem, Ham, and Japheth.

> ¹¹Now the earth was corrupt in God's sight, and the earth was filled with violence. ¹²And God saw the earth, and behold, it was corrupt, for all flesh had corrupted their way on the earth. 13 And God said to Noah, "I have determined to make an end of all flesh, for the earth is filled with violence through them. Behold, I will destroy them with the earth. ¹⁴Make yourself an ark of gopher wood. Make rooms in the ark, and cover it inside and out with pitch. 15 This is how you are to make it: the length of the ark 300 cubits, its breadth 50 cubits, and its height 30 cubits. ¹⁶Make a roof for the ark, and finish it to a cubit above, and set the door of the ark in its side. Make it with lower, second, and third decks. ¹⁷For behold, I will bring a flood of waters upon the earth to destroy all flesh in which is the breath of life under heaven. Everything that is on the earth shall die. ¹⁸But I will establish my covenant with you, and you shall come into the ark, you, your sons, your wife, and your sons' wives with you. 19 And of every living thing of all flesh, you shall bring two of every sort into the ark to keep them alive with you. They shall be male and female. ²⁰Of the birds according to their kinds, and of the animals according to their kinds, of every creeping thing of the ground, according to its kind, two of every sort shall come in to you to keep them alive. 21 Also take with you every sort of food that is eaten, and store it up. It shall serve as food for you and for them." ²²Noah did this; he did all that God commanded him.

¹⁸For Christ also suffered once for sins, the righteous for the unrighteous, that he might bring us to God, being put to death in the flesh but made alive in the spirit, ¹⁹in which he went and proclaimed to the spirits in prison, ²⁰because they formerly did not obey, when God's patience waited in the days of Noah, while the ark was being prepared, in which a few, that is, eight persons, were brought safely through water. ²¹Baptism, which corresponds to this, now saves you, not as a removal of dirt from the body but as an appeal to God for a good conscience, through the resurrection of Jesus Christ, ²²who has gone into heaven and is at the right hand of God, with angels, authorities, and powers having been subjected to him.
