Call Day Memories

his month in April, I and Holy Cross will have our eyes on Concordia Seminary's Call Day more than ever before. As you know, our congregation decided to apply for a candidate from this year's graduates of Concordia Seminary in Saint Louis. Our Pastoral Call Committee had the opportunity to interview four candidates there. On Tues., April 23, we will find out which of them, if any, will be placed at Holy Cross.

We have grown close to our field workers serving us this year: Vince Otto and his wife Dana, and Owen Duncan and his wife Evangeline. They have served Holy Cross so faithfully during this interim, and I would say that we know each of them and their respective families a little bit more than other field workers in the past. They too will officially find out on April 23 where God will be calling them to serve as pastors.

Traditionally there are two worship services on Call Day: the Assignment of Vicarages and Internships service at 3PM, and the Assignment of Calls service at 7PM. I was fortunate to be volunteering during my first year for both of these services, but the biggest and best memories come from my second year and fourth year.

During my second year at the seminary, Call Day meant I would be attending the 3PM service and receiving the assignment of my vicarage. Like a good majority of my classmates, I had no idea whatsoever about where I would be serving the next year on vicarage. Before the service started, I and my friends and classmates were all gathered in the lower level of the seminary chapel. I was feeling pretty eager and excited about the service. While the pre-service conversation was going on, I remember the placement director, Dr. Glenn Nielsen, coming up to me and saying, "Andy, your fieldwork supervisor is here today. Please be sure to stay afterward for a little while to greet him personally." My excitement and eagerness shifted to a thousand thoughts running through my head: "My congregation must be close by for him to be here."-- "I need to tell Laura!"-- "What do I say to him?"

Shortly thereafter, the service itself began. For both the vicarage service and the call service, I and the rest of my classmates receiving vicarages and internships processed in and were seated up in the front right of the seminary chapel together. The rest of the chapel was filled to the brim with every seat taken in the pews.

Overflow seating was available in the lecture hall across campus! The hymns and the singing were full of joy, talent, and vigor, unlike anything else I had experienced.

Eventually, the time came for the placement director to make his announcements. And so we were called up alphabetically one by one to receive our placement and our packet of information about the congregation or ministry. We were instructed to strongly resist the temptation to rip open the envelope right then and there in the pew! I can still remember the announcement of my vicarage assignment at that service as read by Dr. Nielsen: "Andrew Gimbel - Good Shepherd Lutheran Church, Midwest City, Oklahoma." Oh, what joy and excitement I had at that moment!

The Call Day service in my fourth year was different. In previous months, I had three interviews for associate pastor positions in congregations across the country. Following these interviews, both Laura and I were confident as to where we would be placed, so the surprise and the anxiety weren't there. For the service itself, our seating arrangements were the same, as were the joy, talent, and vigor of the music and hymns. Just as with the second-year placement service, I remember the announcement of my call placement quite vividly: "Andrew Gimbel, Associate Pastor, Holy Cross Lutheran Church, O'Fallon, Missouri."

The biggest takeaway from each of these services is the power and impact of God sending forth workers into His harvest field. For those two hours, more than 100 men were gathered together in the same physical location. In the course of the next several months, those same men were all across the United States, and even on the other side of the world! It was a living and breathing reminder of how God cares for His church and cares for you!

This year we will celebrate as a congregation (Lord-willing) and celebrate with our field workers. However, let us not forget to celebrate God's powerful work of sending workers into His harvest field, proclaiming the name of Jesus to all those who need to hear it so desperately in this world we live in. It is because of this truth that Call Day is one of the most exciting and invigorating events in the life of the Church at large. I'll be celebrating that truth this year on April 23. Will you be celebrating with me too? ~ Pastor Andy Gimbel

Monthly Music Minute for April 2024

A series in which the music director shares some thoughts about the music coming up in church this month

Ileluia! Christ is risen! Uthis year, as the calendar turns over from March to April, the church calendar turns over from Lent to Easter - and, on the church music side of things, that means 50 days of Alleluias, joyful songs, and many beloved hymns.

One of these beloved hymns for many, I am sure, is LSB 633, At the Lamb's High Feast We Sing. It is a beautiful text married to a triumphant tune that ties the story of the resurrection to the Lord's Supper. It is definitely in my top-ten list of favorite hymns. This Easter season, we will sing it a few times: Easter Vigil, Easter Sunday, and April 28 when it is the assigned Hymn of the Day.

Today I'd like to reflect on and break down one specific verse of this hymn, a verse jam-packed with rich theology and poetry, stanza 3:

"Where the paschal blood is poured, Death's dread angel sheathes the sword; Israel's hosts triumphant go Through the wave that drowns the foe. Alleluia!"

There is MUCH here, so let's break it down, line by line. The key to understanding the first line, "Where the paschal blood is poured," has to do with that third word -- "paschal." This is a word we hear a lot this time of year. The Easter candle we light is called the "Paschal" candle. So, what does this word mean? The word "paschal" comes from the Greek word "Pascha," which simply means "Passover". In Orthodox churches, the Easter holiday is called "Pascha" - the term "Easter" didn't come around until much later in the British Isles. So, "paschal blood" means both Passover blood AND Easter blood. How are these two tied together? Let's look at the second line for that.

"Death's dread angel sheathes the sword;" At the first Passover, the blood painted over the doorframe signaled the angel of death to spare that house -and so life was spared. What, then, is our Passover meal? It is the Lord's Supper, Holy Communion, where we too are spared from death and given life, with our sins forgiven in this meal. "Paschal", then, is such an appropriate term to use during Easter, for it is here that we celebrate and take part in our own Passover Lamb. No angel of death can harm us.

Shifting a bit, we move to the third line: "Israel's hosts triumphant go." We move past the Passover meal here to the next event of Exodus -- Israel's march toward the promised land. This line evokes the language of victory; I am reminded of the hymn "This Is the Feast." The people of God march forward, and where?

"Through the wave that drowns the foe." Our minds are brought to the Red Sea. Backs against the wall, God's people walked through the waters of the Red Sea on dry ground -- and Egypt, the enemy, was drowned in the waters as the parted sea came back together. In baptism, we too see our enemy destroyed. Sin is drowned in the waters of baptism. As God's people, as His Israel, around the font we have our Red Sea moment -- and, just like at Passover, God gives us life.

Whew, that's a lot of meaning in just 24 words. I think what I love most about this verse is that it shows how God has always cared for His people, and that, through the sacraments, He continues to do so. The Church is the fulfillment of Israel -- we are His people, and through a meal and water He saves us from sin, death, and the devil. So, we rejoice - Alleluia! Christ is risen!



A good gift plan

can present solutions to challenging family dynamics.

Years ago, a husband and wife were meeting with their LCMS Foundation Gift Planning Counselor, Both had been married before, as their spouses had been called home to Jesus. Each of them brought children into the relationship. The assets they brought were not equal. Urged by the advice of various people, they began considering a way in which they could isolate their assets from each other, creating multiple trusts.

Complicating matters, because they truly loved each other, they wanted to provide for each other when the first of them was called home. They felt uncomfortable about such absolute separation of their assets if they truly were going to share their lives as "one flesh", in keeping with the model of marriage from Genesis 1.

They laid out a complicated stream of thoughts before the LCMS Gift Planning Counselor. After a lengthy conversation, the gift planning counselor noticed an interesting phenomenon about their assets relative to family. Coming into this marriage, one spouse had twice as many financial assets as the other. That same spouse with the greater assets also had twice as many children as the other spouse. The ratio made sense. If they combined their assets and equally divided them among all their children, each child would receive the same amount as if they had put in place a complicated legal set of trusts to separate their assets. The Gift Planning Counselor conveyed a message to their attorney, and they emerged from that attorney with a simple plan that made them feel content. The plan they created together also allowed them to make some gifts to support ministry in the future. In addition, this plan did not foster an imposed separation between their children.

Taking the time for extended conversation and prayer allowed this couple to discern the right thing to do, rather than pursuing plans that would be expensive, complicated, and less than satisfying. Your LCMS Foundation Gift Planning Counselor is available to meet with you in the same way.


