

Tenebrae Vespers April 18, 2025 7PM

AS WE GATHER

This service is the second part of the Triduum (from the Latin for "three days") liturgies. There is no invocation today, for today we continue the worship begun yesterday. Nor will there be a benediction. Today's liturgy is an order of Tenebrae (Latin for "darkness"); in it lights are dimmed and candles extinguished as our Lord nears His death. It ends with the *Strepitus*, a loud sound signifying the closing of the tomb---in Christ's decisive moment our sins have been paid for by His innocent death.



RITE OF FELLOWSHIP

All worshipers are asked to take a moment to sign the red fellowship pad located at the end of the pew by the center aisle and return it to its spot when finished. If you are interested in membership, please provide a phone number or email address so that we may contact you. Thank you.

OFFERINGS will not be gathered during the service, but envelopes may be placed in the wooden box in the Welcome Center.

LIVE-STREAMING Holy Cross will live stream the Good Friday 7PM service on a link at our website (<u>hcross.com</u>). We provide this service for our members who cannot attend worship. The video perspective from the choir loft looks toward the altar and shows all aspects of the service from the sixth row of pews forward. This includes baptisms, children's talks, and communion.

OLD TESTAMENT: Isaiah 52:13-53:12 The Lord has laid on Christ the iniquity of us all.

D ehold, my servant shall act wisely; **D** he shall be high and lifted up, and shall be exalted. ¹⁴As many were astonished at you his appearance was so marred, beyond human semblance, and his form beyond that of the children of mankind— ¹⁵so shall he sprinkle many nations; kings shall shut their mouths because of him; for that which has not been told them they see, and that which they have not heard they understand. ¹Who has believed what they heard from us? And to whom has the arm of the LORD been revealed? ²For he grew up before him like a young plant, and like a root out of dry ground; he had no form or majesty that we should look at him, and no beauty that we should desire him. ³He was despised and rejected by men; a man of sorrows, and acquainted with grief; and as one from whom men hide their faces he was despised, and we esteemed him not. ⁴Surely he has borne our griefs and carried our sorrows; yet we esteemed him stricken, smitten by God, and afflicted. ⁵But he was wounded for our transgressions; he was crushed for our iniquities; upon him was the chastisement that brought us peace, and with his stripes we are healed. ⁶All we like sheep have gone astray; we have turned every one to his own way; and the LORD has laid on him the iniquity of us all.

⁷He was oppressed, and he was afflicted, yet he opened not his mouth; like a lamb that is led to the slaughter, and like a sheep that before its shearers is silent, so he opened not his mouth. ⁸By oppression and judgment he was taken away; and as for his generation, who considered that he was cut off out of the land of the living, stricken for the transgression of my people? ⁹And they made his grave with the wicked and with a rich man in his death. although he had done no violence, and there was no deceit in his mouth. ¹⁰Yet it was the will of the LORD to crush him; he has put him to grief; when his soul makes an offering for sin, he shall see his offspring; he shall prolong his days; the will of the LORD shall prosper in his hand. ¹¹Out of the anguish of his soul he shall see and be satisfied; by his knowledge shall the righteous one, my servant, make many to be accounted righteous, and he shall bear their iniquities. ¹²Therefore I will divide him a portion with the many, and he shall divide the spoil with the strong, because he poured out his soul to death and was numbered with the transgressors; yet he bore the sin of many, and makes intercession for the transgressors.

S ince then we have a great high priest who has passed through the heavens, Jesus, the Son of God, let us hold fast our confession. ¹⁵For we do not have a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses, but one who in every respect has been tempted as we are, yet without sin. ¹⁶Let us then with confidence draw near to the throne of grace, that we may receive mercy and find grace to help in time of need.

⁷In the days of His flesh, Jesus offered up prayers and supplications, with loud cries and tears, to Him who was able to save Him from death, and He was heard because of His reverence. ⁸Although He was a son, He learned obedience through what He suffered. ⁹And being made perfect, He became the source of eternal salvation to all who obey Him.

Please Stand



THE FIRST WORD: Luke 23:33-34

And when they came to the place that is called The Skull, there on His left. And Jesus said, "Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do." And they cast lots to divide His garments.

Holy Lord God, holy and mighty God, holy and most merciful Redeemer, in the hour of Your death You begged forgiveness for those who persecuted You. Teach us to forgive as You forgive, that we may die to sin, and walk in newness of life. Through Jesus Christ, our Lord,

HOMILY

THE SECOND WORD: Luke 23:38-43

There was also an inscription over Him, "This is the King of the Jews." One of the criminals who were hanged railed at Him, saying, "Are You not the Christ? Save Yourself and us!" But the other rebuked him, saying, "Do you not fear God, since you are under the same sentence of condemnation? And we indeed justly, for we are receiving the due reward of our deeds; but this man has done nothing wrong." And he said, "Jesus, remember me when You come into Your kingdom." And He said to him, "Truly, I say to you, today you will be with Me in Paradise."

Prayer

P Let us pray.

Holy Lord God, holy and mighty God, holy and most merciful Redeemer, in the hour of Your death You remembered the thief and gave the promise of paradise. Teach us to follow you, that we may die to sin, and walk in newness of life. Through Jesus Christ, our Lord.

After the introduction, the choir sings the song once through. The congregation then repeats the song several times thereafter. The final repetition of the song will be sung unaccompanied.



THE THIRD WORD: John 19:25-27

S tanding by the cross of Jesus were his mother and his mother's sister, Mary the wife of Clopas, and Mary Magdalene. ²⁶When Jesus saw his mother and the disciple whom he loved standing nearby, he said to his mother, "Woman, behold, your son!" ²⁷Then he said to the disciple, "Behold, your mother!" And from that hour the disciple took her to his own home.



A fter this, Jesus, knowing that all was now finished, said (to fulfill the Scripture), "I thirst."


The fifth candle is extinguished.

The final candle is then extinguished.

After a brief time, a loud noise (the Strepitus) is heard, symbolizing the closing of the tomb, the earthquake at the time of Christ's death, and the "closing of the book" on Jesus' sacrifice.

The bell will toll 33 times, once for each year of our Lord's earthly life.

When the ringing is finished, you may remain for meditation and reflection as long as you wish. When you leave, please leave in silence.

The service continues tomorrow at 7PM with the Vigil of Easter. Easter Festival services are on Sunday morning at 7, 9, and 11AM. Donuts and fellowship in the gym between Easter services.
