Reflecting on Confirmation

t's no secret that Confirmation at Holy Cross has undergone some major changes recently. I'm fully aware this has generated some confusion, leaving many to wonder "Why?" and "How come?" Pastor Gimbel, DCE Charity Smith and I took several weeks in May to address the current Confirmation program in our Sunday Adult Bible Class, and I'm not so interested in revisiting our rationale in this article. Check out our Bible class recordings if you want to learn more! Instead, I'd simply like to share with you what I have observed happening at Holy Cross as a result of these changes. Put yourselves in my shoes, for a moment, as I walk you through my average week here:

MONDAY

I arrive at the church building, Starbucks in hand, and pass by my mailbox on my way to the office. I notice, as usual, a stack of yellow service summaries submitted by our students from the weekend's worship services, ready and waiting for my evaluation and feedback. I scoop them into my open arm, unlock my office door, and look through the summaries immediately. I jot a couple notes here and there, I smile at what they got out of the sermon, and I answer some intelligent questions about the Nicene Creed. It might be a pain, I think to myself, but they're paying attention in church way better than I ever did.

WEDNESDAY

It's 6:10pm, more than enough time to set up for my class in 20 minutes. I hear chatter and laughter from the Sacristy as a few parishioners, including one of our Confirmation students, set up for worship this weekend. They handle small yet vital tasks that go almost entirely unnoticed, such as replacing the numbers on the hymnal board and refilling candles with enough oil. I grab my podium and notes from my office and walk towards the Welcome Center. The handbell choir is practicing in the Sanctuary, and it's mostly comprised of our youth and Confirmation students. They sound lovely, but I can't interrupt and tell them that.

SATURDAY

It's my turn to preach, so I try to show up an hour before the service...but I'm running 15 minutes late. When I arrive, there's a group of people already waiting at the locked front door—a Confirmation student and her parents, ready to usher and wondering why I haven't let them in yet. They assure me it's no problem, and within five minutes they're stationed with stacks of bulletins and ready to personally greet everyone that enters the church. They even unlock the other doors and turn the Welcome Center TVs on for me so I can finish preparing for the service.

SUNDAY

The service begins. Pastor Gimbel conducts liturgy while I try not to think about my sermon too much. The Word is read, some hymns are sung, I preach and sit back down. The choir sings a special piece during the offertory; the pulpit blocks half my view of them in the balcony. But in the half I can see, I spot a couple of our students singing side-by-side with the adults. This place is awesome, I marvel silently. It wasn't the first time.

On my way out, I pass by my mailbox, and sitting within it is a fresh stack of service summaries, begging for my attention. It means more work for me tomorrow morning...but I'm glad they're there.

Discipleship. My one-word summary of Confirmation here. It's more than attaining knowledge...it's also about acquiring skills and developing disciplines that are necessary to live the Christian life according to Jesus' call. I only described to you a fraction of what our Confirmation students are up to these days; I left the work of several students out entirely. But I'll say this about them all: they are more than young people with a bright future. They are young disciples who are using their God-given gifts, right now, to serve this church in a myriad of ways.

This place is awesome. And so are these people.

Monthly Music Minute for June 2025

A series in which the music director shares some thoughts about the music coming up in church this month

ne of my favorite days of hymnody is coming up soon: Trinity Sunday! Trinity Sunday, June 15, is the last major day of the festival half of the church year. On the week following Pentecost, Trinity Sunday is the last feast day before we move to the green season, or Ordinary Time, until Advent. Your memories of Trinity Sunday may include singing bold hymns like "Holy, Holy, Holy" and "Holy God, We Praise Thy Name," learning imperfect analogies of how to understand the nature of the Trinity (the very-flawed apple analogy comes to mind), and reciting the very thorough, if a little bit lengthy, Athanasian Creed.

I like the hymnody of this day so much because these hymns are complete prayers to each person of the Trinity. We sing praises to Father, to Son, and to Holy Spirit; we pray songs of our beginning, our now, and our yet to come. Hymns trying to praise a God this great and mystical must be theologically rich and musically powerful, and so many of them certainly are.

However, we don't just sing hymns to the Trinity on Trinity Sunday. We have a practice of singing what we call "doxological" stanzas at the end of many hymns. I thought it might be interesting to share the history of how this practice of ending hymns with a doxological stanza came into place.

The Lutheran Service Book: Companion to the Services defines "doxology" as this: "Greek: δοξολογία, 'word of praise.'Generally, any expression of praise to God, especially a trinitarian formulation. Specifically, the **Gloria Patri** ('Glory be to the Father and to the Son . . .', (used to conclude psalms and canticles. By extension, a concluding 'doxological'stanza in hymns that acts as a metered Gloria Patri" (p. xxxv-xxxvi).

Singing to the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit as part of a hymn dates back to at least the fourth century. At the time, many Christians sang doxologies in response to followers of the Arian heresy, which said that the Son was not coequal to the Father. By the eleventh century, ending hymns with a doxological stanza was a common practice, with the same doxological texts often put in multiple different hymns. This is a practice we still have today (see the final stanzas of LSBs 805, 883, and 923 for an example).

Doxological stanzas are only marked with the triangle signifying standing if the hymn addresses praise to the three persons of the Trinity. We have some hymns, like LSBs 644 "The Church's One Foundation" and 417 "Alleluia, Song of Gladness," whose final stanzas are about the Trinity, but the praises are not sung directly to the three persons, and so there is no triangle.

Doxologies are not just final verses to hymns. We see doxologies at the end of psalms and in other parts of our liturgy. The Venite in Matins and the Magnificat in Evening Prayer end with doxologies. The Gloria in Excelsis, a song we sing at the beginning of almost every service, is sometimes called the Greater Doxology, as it is a hymn that expands on each person of the Trinity, with a particular focus on the work of Christ.

But let's get back to the hymns themselves for a moment. You are likely familiar with the practice of standing if a hymn stanza is marked with a triangle. These stanzas are doxological stanzas, or final stanzas offering praise to the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Often times you will hear me put on the zimbelstern on the organ, a series of small bells that ring at random, traditionally used to signify singing things that are from above.

For something that may seem on the surface so liturgical, the practice of standing for doxological stanzas is relatively recent. Other than some secondhand recollection from LCMS pastors in the 1940s and 50s, there is no record of this practice. Indeed, it appears to be all but unknown outside of the LCMS. Even within our synod, the practice has not been consistent. For example, in some churches the people stand for all doxological stanzas; in others they do not stand if the hymn is sung during Communion, and in others they do not stand at all.

So, why stand? In a synod whose identity is so rooted in good liturgical practice, why include such a recent practice? There's not one definite reason, at least that I found in my research. Personally, I like to think of it this way: for a Triune God who is so mighty, whose power and might and mystery is so great, the idea that we are pulled out of our seats, overcome with awe at God's great, mysterious nature as we sing is a particularly cool image.


Something we love about Holy Cross is the parents who send the younger siblings because they loved their time here so much with the older ones! Next year we have four returning families with younger siblings--how special!

One last thought on this, though. The practice of standing for doxological stanzas is NOT a requirement, no more than standing or kneeling is for the Confession of Sins. And while good liturgical practice can help center ourselves on things above, it is also helpful to remember that these practices are (sometimes even recently) man-made constructs, and not commands from the scriptures. If standing is difficult for you, or if it is just not something you think makes a lot of sense, that's fine! Christian Freedom removes any requirement or necessity of action from us.

As we head into this non-festival season of the church year, see if you can spot the little doxological "festivals" we have scattered throughout the green season in these last verses of hymns. Add that little extra "oomph" to your singing when we get to them. And stand in awe of your wonderful Triune God. - David Gilson



ByLaw Proposals: Next Steps

Thank you to everyone who attended the Bylaw Education Sessions in April and May! We are receiving great feedback from the congregation. The open comment period has ended (5/18 - 6/1), but the Bylaw Committee is reviewing all feedback and making adjustments to the Bylaw draft proposal as appropriate. Next steps are below:

- 1. Bylaw Committee reviews feedback and adjusts Bylaw draft proposal (June/July)
- 2. A final Bylaw draft proposal will be publicized for a 2-week review period by Voters' Assembly members (June/July)
- 3. A special Voters' Assembly will be called (likely in July) for a vote to approve or reject the Bylaws
- 4. If approved by the Voters' Assembly, the Bylaws will then go on to the Missouri District for final approval
- 5. Pending District approval, the Bylaws will go into effect at the November Voters' Assembly


