
Preschool Starts Sept. 2

Monthly Music Minute for August 2025

A series in which the music director shares some thoughts about the music coming up in church this month

August is here, and at Holy Cross, that means back to a more normal routine! Summer is ending, and our educational program will begin in full force - and that includes our music department! It is an exciting time, as we get many members involved in leading the church's song.

On August 10, one of the hymns we will sing is the beloved LSB 790, "Praise to the Lord, the Almighty." The final stanza of this hymn is a great prayer about praising God through the church's song:

Praise to the Lord! O Let all that is in me adore Him! All that has life and breath, come now with praises before Him! Let the Amen Sound from His people again; Gladly forever adore Him!

How can you, the Holy Cross parishioner, fulfill that prayer? I'd like to share with you some ways that you might be able to do so as the school year begins. As always, if you have any questions at all, please come talk to myself, David Gilson, or shoot me an email at dgilson@hcross.com.

1. CONGREGATIONAL SONG

By far, the most important thing you can do to be involved in worship is simply to sing with the congregation. One of the great blessings of Holy Cross, to me, is that we are a singing congregation, and that starts with you in the pew! Sing in church, whether you think you have a good voice or not. Sing from your heart. Sing with all your being. And when you've done that, keep singing. Proclaim boldly the faith. Share with one another the truths and comforts of the Gospel. And keep the words of these great hymns of faith on your hearts.

Many pastors I've spoken to tell me the same thing: when people are on their deathbed, sedated and non-responsive, very often one of the only expressions of faith they can share are mouthing along to the words of hymns they have sung and kept in their hearts. We imprint these songs not just by listening, but by singing them repeatedly. The song of the church matters, and so does your voice in it.

2. HANDBELLS

Beyond congregational song, we do have some specific groups you can join if you'd like to get even more involved, and that doesn't even necessarily have to be singing! One fun way to get involved is by joining the **Adult Handbell Choir**.

This group will meet **Monday nights from 6:30-7:30PM**, **beginning August 25.** Open to ringers high-school age on up, this ensemble rings in church about once a month and at select special services.

If you are interested in being a part of handbells, <u>even if</u> <u>you've rung before</u>, join us on **Monday, August 18 at**

6:30PM, as we will have a handbell orientation event. At this time, if you are new, we will meet and discuss how best to get you involved in the group, and we will also get the handbells out for some polishing/maintenance so that we are ready for the coming season! I am a firm believer that <u>anyone</u> can ring handbells — so, if you're on the fence, come join us on the 18th and give it a shot!

3. CHOIR

Our most established and frequently utilized ensemble, the **Adult Choir** will meet weekly for rehearsals **Wednesday nights from 6:45-8:00pm** in the choir room. Our first rehearsal will be **Wednesday, August 20**. The choir is for those aged high-school-on-up. The choir sings during Sunday church services on average once every three to four weeks, in addition to occasional special services throughout the year.

If you've sung in the choir before, we'd love to have you back! If you haven't but you love singing, you're welcome to join too! And, if you'd like to give it a try but aren't sure you want to commit to a full year-long schedule, we're especially eager to have people join the choir for the first month or so, so that our celebration of the 65th anniversary of the congregation on September 14 might be extra-special.

4. YOUTH MUSIC

After a couple years of trial and growth, we're very excited to bring back music programs geared toward growing not just music skills but the understanding of worship in our young people. We'll once again have a Children's Choir led by Melanie Dafler and a Beginning Handbell ensemble (not necessarily limited to youth!). Details on these groups have yet to be finalized at the time of writing this, but by the time you're reading this, they're likely to have been decided, so reach out to David or Melanie if you'd like to know more!

5. INSTRUMENTAL/SOLO MUSIC

If you play an instrument and you'd like to get involved in some capacity, please talk to your music director! Whether you're a beginner or a professional, whether you're a confident soloist or you'd prefer to play in a group, there's a place for you to play in church. We can figure out what that looks like together.

Psalm 34:3 states, "Oh, magnify the Lord with me, and let us exalt his name together!" That word "together" is key. As we head into a new season at Holy Cross, it is my prayer that, no matter what generation we may be a part of, whether we ring, play instruments, sing in a choir, or sing boldly from the pew each week, we can learn, walk, and worship together as one body, in joyful song of praise to our God. - David Gilson



2025 MISSOURI DISTRICT CONVENTION

Delegates, church workers, and guests from across Missouri gathered in Columbia for the 22nd District Convention under the theme "Bold Hope in Christ" (2 Cor. 3:12). Over the course of three days, attendees joined in worship, elected leaders, engaged in theological reflection, and committed to the work God has called us to in congregations and communities.



Opening Worship

The convention opened with Divine Service Sunday, June 22, 2025. Rev. Peter Lange, first vice president of The Lutheran Church–Missouri Synod (LCMS) (pictured above; photo by: Noah Clark), served as preacher and built on the convention's theme "Bold Hope in Christ."

President's Report

President Rev. Dr. R. Lee Hagan, re-elected as District President, opened the business sessions Monday morning with a message of hope rooted in the unchanging promises of Christ. He celebrated signs of encouragement across the District, including:

- SHINE! servant events, which engaged over 10,000 participants
- Continued growth in Lutheran school enrollment
- Over \$2.3 million in scholarships awarded through the MOScholars program

Hagan noted progress to the four ministry priorities for the past triennium: church worker recruitment, family discipleship, community engagement, and shared ministry. "Our hope," he said, "is not in plans or programs, but in the risen Christ."



A Hope That Transforms

Rev. Dr. Kevin Golden, associate professor at Concordia Seminary and longtime Missouri District pastor (pictured above; photo by: Noah Clark), delivered Part I of the Convention Essay on Monday afternoon. Drawing from 2 Cor. 3:12, Golden explored what it means to live boldly because of our hope in Christ.

Using illustrations from The Shawshank Redemption, and rich Scriptural imagery, he reminded delegates that Christian hope is grounded, not vague. "If your hope is in your hope," Golden warned, "then your hope is uncertain. But in Christ, it is specific, secure, and bold."

Convention Business, Elections

In addition to resolutions and other business, delegates elected leadership for the next triennium. Rev. Dr. R. Lee Hagan was reelected president of the Missouri District Monday, June 23, 2025. **Hagan received 100% of the votes cast on the first ballot.**

Rev. Craig Otto, senior pastor of St. Matthew Lutheran Church in Lee's Summit, was elected first vice president by just one vote, receiving 50.16% of the ballots. Elected second through fourth vice presidents, respectively, were: Rev. Randy Asburry, sole pastor of Hope Lutheran Church in St. Louis; Rev. Samuel Powell, senior pastor of Trinity Lutheran Church in Jefferson City; and Rev. Richard Cody, sole pastor of St. Peter Lutheran Church in St. Joseph.


