**HOLY COMMUNION AT HOLY CROSS** is celebrated in accordance with the Lutheran confession that Christ's body and blood are truly given to us with the bread and wine to give forgiveness of sins, life, and salvation to repentant, reconciled believers in Christ. Missouri-Synod Lutherans united with us in that confession are invited to receive the Sacrament with us. Others who desire to commune should first speak with a Pastor or an Elder.

- For those who may require it: Holy Cross offers an alcohol-removed red wine (containing less than 0.5% alcohol) located in the center of each Communion tray.
- Gluten-free wafers are available upon request to a Pastor or Elder before the service.
- Communion in the pew is available: let an usher or Elder know before the service.
- Individual Communion cups: Please do not stack the plastic cups in the baskets after use at communion. Stacked cups stick together and hinder the rinsing process. Thanks for understanding!

**ATTENDANCE PADS:** Take a moment to sign the red fellowship pad located by the center aisle of each pew. Provide contact information if you are interested in membership or if you would like to be contacted by the church. After signing, please pass it to your neighbor and then return it to its spot by the aisle.

**LIVE-STREAMING of 8 AM SERVICE WEEKLY:** Holy Cross live streams the 8 AM service each Sunday on a link at our website (<a href="https://ncross.com">https://ncross.com</a>). We provide this service for our members who cannot attend worship. The video perspective from the choir loft looks toward the altar and shows all aspects of the service from the sixth row of pews forward. This includes baptisms, children's talks, and communion.





And when I looked, behold, a hand was stretched out to me, and behold, a scroll of a book was in it. 10 And He spread it before me. And it had writing on the front and on the back, and there were written on it words of lamentation and mourning and woe.

nd He said to me, "Son of man, eat whatever you find here. Eat this scroll, and go, speak to the house of Israel." <sup>2</sup>So I opened my mouth, and He gave me this scroll to eat. <sup>3</sup>And He said to me, "Son of man, feed your belly with this scroll that I give you and fill your stomach with it." Then I ate it, and it was in my mouth as sweet as honey.

<sup>4</sup>And He said to me, "Son of man, go to the house of Israel and speak with My words to them. <sup>5</sup>For you are not sent to a people of foreign speech and a hard language, but to the house of Israel— anot to many peoples of foreign speech and a hard language, whose words you cannot understand. Surely, if I sent you to such, they would listen to you. 7But the house of Israel will not be willing to listen to you, for they are not willing to listen to Me. Because all the house of Israel have a hard forehead and a stubborn heart. 8Behold, I have made your face as hard as their faces, and your forehead as hard as their foreheads. Like emery harder than flint have I made your forehead. Fear them not, nor be dismayed at their looks, for they are a rebellious house." <sup>10</sup>Moreover, He said to me, "Son of man, all my words that I shall speak to you receive in your heart, and hear with your ears. <sup>11</sup>And go to the exiles, to your people, and speak to them and say to them, 'Thus says the Lord God,' whether they hear or refuse to hear."

"When He ascended on high He led a host of captives, and He gave gifts to men."


<sup>9</sup>(In saying, "He ascended," what does it mean but that He had also descended into the lower parts of the earth? <sup>10</sup>He who descended is the one who also ascended far above all the heavens, that He might fill all things.) <sup>11</sup>And He gave the apostles, the prophets, the evangelists, the pastors and teachers, <sup>12</sup>to equip the saints for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ, <sup>13</sup>until we all attain to the unity of the faith and of the knowledge of the Son of God, to mature manhood, to the measure of the stature of the fullness of Christ, <sup>14</sup>so that we may no longer be children, tossed to and fro by the waves and carried about by every wind of doctrine, by human cunning, by craftiness in deceitful schemes. <sup>15</sup>Rather, speaking the truth in love, we are to grow up in every way into Him who is the head, into Christ, <sup>16</sup>from whom the whole body, joined and held together by every joint with which it is equipped, when each part is working properly, makes the body grow so that it builds itself up in love.

I acknowledge one Baptism for the remission of sins,






### The Words of Our Lord

# St. Matthew, Apostle and Evangelist

**St. Matthew** (flourished 1st century CE, Palestine; Western feast day September 21, Eastern feast day November 16) was one of the <u>Twelve Apostles</u> of <u>Jesus Christ</u> and the traditional author of the <u>first Synoptic Gospel</u> (the <u>Gospel According to Matthew</u>).

According to Matthew 9:9 and Mark 2:14, Matthew was sitting by the customs house in <u>Capernaum</u> (near modern Almagor, <u>Israel</u>, on the <u>Sea of Galilee</u>) when Jesus called him into his company. Assuming that the identification of Matthew with Levi is correct, Matthew (probably meaning "Yahweh's Gift") would appear to be the <u>Christian</u>

<u>name</u> of Levi (called by Mark "Levi the son of Alphaeus"), who had been employed as a tax collector in the service of <u>Herod Antipas</u>, tetrarch of <u>Galilee</u>.

Because Levi's occupation was one that earned distrust and <u>contempt</u> everywhere, the scribes of the <u>Pharisees</u> criticized Jesus on seeing him eat with tax collectors and sinners, whereupon Jesus answered, "I came not to call the righteous, but sinners" (Mark 2:15–17). According to Luke 5:29, the aforementioned dinner was given by Levi in his house after his call.

Other than naming Matthew in the list of Apostles, usually pairing him with <u>St. Thomas</u>, the <u>New Testament</u> offers scant and uncertain information about him. Outside the New Testament, a statement of importance about him is the passage from the <u>Apostolic Father Papias of Hierapolis</u> preserved by Bishop <u>Eusebius of Caesarea</u>: "So then Matthew composed the Oracles in the <u>Hebrew language</u>, and each one interpreted them as he could. "<u>The Gospel According to Matthew</u> was certainly written for a Jewish-Christian church in a strongly Jewish <u>environment</u>, but that this Matthew is definitely the Synoptic author is seriously doubted. Tradition notes his ministry in <u>Judaea</u>, after which he supposedly missioned to the East, suggesting <u>Ethiopia</u> and <u>Persia</u>. <u>Legend</u> differs as to the scene of his missions and as to whether he died a natural death or a <u>martyr</u>'s. Matthew's <u>relics</u> were reputedly discovered in <u>Salerno</u> (Italy) in 1080. His symbol is an angel, and he is a <u>patron saint</u> of tax collectors and accountants.
