As We Gather

Holy Cross Lutheran Church was founded on Holy Cross Day, September 14, 1960, as a mission church from Immanuel Lutheran Church in Wentzville. Since then, Holy Cross has been an active congregation serving north O'Fallon and surrounding communities.

HOLY COMMUNION AT HOLY CROSS is celebrated in accordance with the Lutheran confession that Christ's body and blood are truly given to us with the bread and wine to give forgiveness of sins, life, and salvation to repentant, reconciled believers in Christ. Missouri-Synod Lutherans united with us in that confession are invited to receive the Sacrament with us. Others who desire to commune should first speak with a Pastor or an Elder.

- For those whose health or circumstance may require it, Holy Cross offers an alcohol-removed red wine (containing less than 0.5% alcohol) located in the center of each Communion tray.
- Gluten-free wafers are available upon request to a Pastor or Elder before the service.
- If you want communion in the pew, please let an usher or Elder know before the service.
- Please do **not** stack the plastic communion cups in the baskets. Stacked cups hinder the rinsing process. Thank you.

ATTENDANCE PADS: We invite members and guests to take a moment to sign the red fellowship pad located at the end of the pew by the center aisle. Please provide contact information if you are interested in membership or if you would like to be contacted by the church. After signing, please pass it to your neighbor and then return it to its spot by the aisle.

LIVE-STREAMING of 8 AM SERVICE WEEKLY: Holy Cross live streams the 8 AM service each Sunday on a link at our website (https://example.com/). We provide this service for our members who cannot attend worship. The video perspective from the choir loft looks toward the altar and shows all aspects of the service from the sixth row of pews forward. This includes baptisms, children's talks, and communion.

Those with hearing aids with a Bluetooth connection can download and use a smartphone or tablet app that broadcasts the service to their hearing aids.

For 65 years, Holy Cross Day has been celebrated as the church anniversary for Holy Cross Lutheran Church as it has continued to grow in the O'Fallon, Missouri, community. Church members can reflect God's once again on outpouring generosity, of kindness, and love shown by the people gathered herein.

The message of the cross is the message of Christianity. It has become the shorthand symbol for the whole story of Jesus Christ — from birth to life to death to resurrection. The paradox of faith is that this sign of death has been transformed into the mark of life. Placed upon us in Baptism the cross is the personal mark of Jesus Christ and His claim on us for the kingdom of light and life.

The cross of Jesus displays for believers and unbelievers alike just how foolish God is in His limitless grace. He stops at nothing to redeem us lost and condemned creatures, even to becoming a man who would be killed. Yet the cross, an instrument of death, also shows us God's power to overcome every obstacle — sin, death, and the power of Satan. This He does to draw all people into life eternal. God's wisdom seems strangely foolish. And yet it triumphs over the wisdom of men. Jesus is killed on the cross and we become the eternal recipients of grace, mercy, and life.

On this day Lutherans draw special attention to this theology of the cross—that God's glory is chiefly displayed in the humility, service, suffering and death of Jesus for us and our salvation.
