Monthly Music Minute for September 2025

A series in which the music director shares some thoughts about the music coming up in church this month

Every year for the church's auction, I donate a personalized arrangement of a hymn, where the winner and I sit down, choose a favorite hymn, and I add my personal compositional touch to it. In the past, people have used this for various occasions. For example, last year's winner, Dana Otto, asked me to arrange one of Vince's favorite hymns for his ordination service.

This year's winner, however, did not have such a specific occasion in mind. Her primary request was that it simply be for us, the people at Holy Cross, to enjoy singing God's praises together.

Now, that's a pretty broad ask. So, she and I sat down and looked through several hymns, trying to narrow down our possibilities. We looked at many options, both familiar and unfamiliar, but when we got to LSB 941, "We Praise You and Acknowledge You, O God," and we started looking through the text, her face lit right up. Immediately, I knew this was the hymn she wanted me to arrange, and there would be no point in looking further.

Honestly, I was a bit intimidated to take on this hymn. Firstly, the tune of the hymn is the famous melody from Gustav Holst's *Jupiter*, one of the more hauntingly beautiful melodies in our hymnal. That tune is so iconic and wonderfully original that I was unsure what I could add to it to make it unique.

Besides this, the text of the hymn is a modern versification of the Te Deum, one of (if not the) greatest hymn texts that Christianity has ever produced. I've written about the Te Deum before; for a refresher, the Te Deum is an ancient hymn that dates back to at least the 600s, and likely earlier. It is a hymn about all people throughout time, past, present, and future, and all creation, celebrating and acknowledging God for who He is and what He has done.

So, I had some hurdles to overcome. How could I put my unique voice and the voice of Holy Cross in the year 2025 into such a timeless hymn?

The more I thought about it, though, the more I realized that asking me to set a version of the Te Deum was an incredibly appropriate choice by our

hymn arrangement winner. If her intent was for us to sing praises together, what better text to sing than the song that the Church has been singing since its very beginning? What better way to lift our voices to God than with the words of those who have come before and who will come after?

And so, with this in mind, I'm very excited to announce that we'll be singing my arrangement of LSB 941, "We Praise You and Acknowledge You, O God," as the closing hymn of our 65th anniversary services on September 13-14. You see, Holy Cross's 65th anniversary is not simply a celebration of 65 years of teaching, preaching, and sharing God's Word in this place, at this time. It is, rather, a celebration of God's unending faithfulness to His people throughout time, past, present, and future.

God has been faithful to His people from the very beginning of time, when he promised to Adam and Eve that He would send a Savior, when He carried Israel through the Red Sea and drowned their enemies, when He delivered Israel from captivity to Babylon, when He sent His only Son to suffer, to die, to rise in our place, that we, His people -- from Adam to Moses to Daniel to Paul to each of us in O'Fallon, Missouri, might be united with Him and with each other forever. And forever together we will sing of the greatness of God, as the hymn proclaims:

The band of the apostles in glory sing Your praise; The fellowship of prophets their deathless voices raise.

The martyrs of Your kingdom, a great and noble throng,

Sing with the holy Church throughout all the world this song:

"O all-majestic Father, Your true and only Son, And Holy Spirit, Comforter — forever Three in one! ...May we with saints be numbered where praises never end In glory everlasting, Amen, O Lord, Amen!

Indeed, let our prayer this 65th anniversary and always be one of thanksgiving, that, through God's great love for us, we are numbered with those saints, where those praises never end.

Outback Campout: Fellowship in God's Creation

On May 15–16, around 35 members gathered for our annual Outback Campout held on the back lot. Friday evening began with a potluck dinner and continued on Saturday with shared meals, music, devotions, and games like washers and ladder golf. Disaster Relief: A Generous Response

In times of crisis, your compassion shines! This summer, our congregation contributed over \$9,000 to support disaster relief efforts. By the numbers we sent: \$4,424 to the Missouri District for general disaster relief, \$2,958 to LERT Missouri District for assistance with tornado clean up efforts, and \$2,331 to the Texas District for flood recovery. 


A Visit to Our Lutheran Roots in Perry County

On Sat., Oct. 11, Holy Cross is planning a day bus trip to Altenburg and Frohna, Mo., where German Lutherans first settled when they came to America. We will visit the Lutheran Heritage Center & Museum in Altenburg and tour the Log Cabin College which was the LCMS first seminary. The museum galleries have maps showing where the Saxon German immigrants came from in Germany. Learn the history of how they arrived in 1839 and their struggle to establish churches, farms, and businesses. You will learn about the foundation they established for the LCMS through their hard work.

In the afternoon we will attend the Fall Festival at Saxony Lutheran Memorial in Frohna. You will get the opportunity to tour historic log cabins, watch demonstrations of activities common in the mid 1800's, enjoy great German food and entertainment, and browse the wares of many local crafters.
