Old Testament Prophesies Fulfilled

uring this Advent season, in the weeks leading up to Christmas, Holy Cross will be taking a closer look at some of the Old Testament prophecies that were fulfilled in Jesus Christ. On Wednesdays, we will examine the passages that are fulfilled at the birth of Christ, as recorded in the Gospel according to Saint Matthew. On weekends, we will study the Old Testament lectionary readings from the book of the prophet Isaiah.

Really, it is amazing how there are so many prophecies about Jesus, and even more amazing how Jesus Christ fulfilled every single one of them!

Though the exact number is debatable, scholars suggest that there are over 300 prophecies fulfilled in the person of Jesus Christ. The Old Testament has many made hundreds of years before Jesus was born. These aren't just big, broad generalizations either -- these are precise and detailed prophecies. For example, Micah 5:2 tells us the exact city in which Jesus would be born. Isaiah 7:14 tells us about how Jesus would be born of a virgin. Psalm 34:20 tells us about how he would die.

History has proven without any doubt whatsoever that they were fulfilled exactly as the writers of the Old Testament had prophesied hundreds of years earlier.

In the book *Science Speaks*, mathematician and scientist Peter Stoner applies the rules of probability to the prophecies. The chances of just eight of these 300 prophecies being fulfilled are one in 10 to the 17th power. In math terms, that number is written 10¹⁷. The number is officially one hundred quintillion, which means it's the number one followed by 17 zeroes, which would look like this: 100,000,000,000,000,000

To help you try and visualize the odds of this, take that number of silver dollars, and lay them on the face of the state of Texas. They will cover the entire state two feet deep. Now, imagine if one of these silver dollars had a special marking on it. Next, thoroughly mix all the silver dollars. Finally, put a blindfold on a man and tell him he must pick out that marked silver dollar. What chance would he have of getting the one with the special marking on it? It would be the same chance that the prophets would have of writing these eight prophecies and having them all come true in any one man.

I don't know about you, but that is pretty amazing, wouldn't you say? However, those odds are for only eight of the 300+ prophecies! If you adjust that figure to merely 48 of these prophecies being fulfilled, the odds then jump to a staggering one in ten to the 157th power (10¹⁵⁷); in other words, the number one followed by 157 zeros. That number looks like this:

That's a lot of zeroes! Our Lord clearly had a plan laid out for us to fulfill His promises to come into this world through Jesus Christ to save us. This was not something coincidental or left to chance. Rather, it was the determination and will of God to rescue you and me. And now we get to be the beneficiaries of the odds being in our favor!

Monthly Music Minute for November 2025

A series in which the music director shares some thoughts about the music coming up in church this month

on Sun., Nov. 23, the adult choir will be singing an anthem entitled "Holy Emmanuel, God with Us Ever," with words and music by Lutheran pastor Paul D. Weber. The text is as follows:

Holy Emmanuel, God with us ever, Promised from long ago, the One True Light: Come, fill us with your grace, scatter the darkness,

Holy, Holy Emmanuel.

Holy Emmanuel, child of the Most High, Word, full of grace and truth, in flesh and blood: May we perceive your light amidst the darkness, Holy, Holy Emmanuel.

Holy Emmanuel, keep us together. Unite our lives through prayer; love never ends. Comfort and fill our hearts with your strong presence,

Holy, Holy Emmanuel.

Holy Emmanuel, hope for tomorrow: Brighten the path we walk to endless day. Until you come again we trust your promise, Holy, Holy Emmanuel.

It's a wonderful prayer, to be sure; it's personal, comforting, and keeps everything focused on Jesus. There's more to the story of this anthem, though. Here's what Rev. Weber wrote about this piece:

"[This piece] was composed on Pentecost Day 2014 as I was driving home from Pittsburgh to North Carolina. I had just attended the final service of Holy Emmanuel Lutheran Church in Pittsburgh, the first congregation that I served as pastor from 1979-1986. Pentecost Day is the birthday of the church, but on June 8, 2014, it marked the closing of a congregation and the sending forth of its members to other churches. At the end of the liturgy, I was invited to recess with the baptismal bowl from which I had baptized two of our children. It was an uplifting day with inspiring worship and a banquet during which fond memories were shared, but it was on the way home that tears began to flow. I pulled off of

Interstate 79 and recorded this text and tune on my iPhone. The Holy Spirit was active in the lives of the saints of Holy Emmanuel."

With this backstory in mind, I encourage you to go back and re-read the text of this anthem again. It takes on a new meaning, doesn't it? Perhaps a little sadder, but perhaps a little bit more comforting at the same time. The text is obviously inspired by the name of the congregation, "Holy Emmanuel," but what Rev. Weber does with the text is quite special. Do you remember what "Emmanuel" means? Matthew 1:23 gives us the answer: "God with us."

I can only imagine how much the members of Holy Emmanuel Lutheran Church must've needed to hear that reminder, "God with us," as their church was closing. In truth, it's a reminder that I think we constantly need in our own lives. It's easy to feel close to God when things are going well. No doubt we all probably strongly felt God with us during our 65th anniversary celebrations, for example. But not everything in the Christian life is triumphant; not everything is celebratory; not everything goes as planned. Sometimes sickness strikes, families divide, churches close, and lives end.

Yet I am reminded of what the prophet says in Isaiah 40:8: "The grass withers, the flower fades, but the word of our God will stand forever." Even though the world may fail us, even though others may hurt us, we can always take comfort in this simple three-word promise: "God with us." He will remain with us even to the last day, when he promises to take us to himself in glory. And God always keeps his promises.

And so I encourage you, in good times and in bad, to make the final words of this anthem your prayer:

- "Until you come again we trust your promise, Holy, Holy Emmanuel."



Trip to Perry County and Our Lutheran Roots

On Saturday, October 11, a bus load of Holy Cross members visited Altenburg and Frohna, MO to learn a little more about the early Lutherans who settled Missouri in 1838-39. We visited the Lutheran Heritage Center & Museum in Altenburg first which contained numerous articles from the first church at Wittenberg, MO down near the Mississippi River. The town and church no longer exist. The museum contained many musical instruments from that period as well as numerous personal items from the homes of the early immigrants.



Next two members from the museum took us into Trinity Lutheran Church located next to the museum and shared information about the immigration of the Saxon Lutherans in 1838 and the history of Trinity celebrating their 186 anniversary this year. They had a baptismal bowl that had traveled over from Germany in 1838 and a communion chalice that dated back to 1700. We then toured the Log Cabin Seminary located on the property which was the first training place for Lutheran pastors.

In the afternoon we went to Frohna and the Fall Festival at Saxony Lutheran Memorial. We enjoyed German food and music, had time to visit numerous craft displays, and learned the



Schnitzelbank song. Brain and Jennie Williamson, ambassadors for Saxony Lutheran Memorial shared plans to make the 33-acre site into a retreat center for Lutheran pastors, teachers, and their families to recharge, heal and strengthen their faith. These retreats will provide support and renewal, fostering peace and restoration for those who serve the church and equipping them to continue their vital work with renewed energy and spiritual clarity.

Thanks to the elders for underwriting this fantastic day to learn more about our roots and possibly connect us to a way to enhance our future.
