

NOTE FROM COUNCIL PRESIDENT GREG EMERICK REGARDING THE BYLAWS REVISIONS:

The Missouri District has reviewed our proposed new Bylaws and current Constitution. They have recommended some adjustments before final approval. Much of the feedback is focused on our Constitution. The district is asking us to update some language due to legal changes over the last 65 years. There are also a few additions needed to the Bylaws. The Bylaw Committee has agreed to reconvene and will be working through the recommendations in the coming weeks.

We will continue to operate under our old Bylaws for the time being. This means our Church Council structure will remain the same until we repeat the approval process through the Voters' Assembly and the Missouri District. Stay tuned for Special Voters Meetings in the coming months as we seek approval of these changes. Thank you for your patience and understanding through this process.

TRANSFER LUTHERAN CLASS (TLC): If you have recently completed the BASIC instruction class or would like to transfer your membership from another Lutheran congregation, you are invited to this orientation. This is a single-day meeting on **Sun., Oct. 26, at 9:30AM** during the Bible Class hour. 




