ADVENT BEGINS Nov. 29-30

The Advent Series will focus on Old Testament prophecies.

Sunday sermons will be drawn from the book of Isaiah, while Wednesday sermons will focus on the fulfilled prophecies referenced in Matthew 2.



Wednesday services at 11AM & 7PM will be Dec. 3, Dec. 10, and Dec. 17.

Advent Dinners on those same nights will start serving at 5:30PM until 6:45PM. Dinner hosts this week are Holy Cross Preschool; menu— Chili & toppings, soups, crackers, rolls, salad, desserts.

THE GIVING TREE: The Missions and Stewardship Boards are partnering with Youth in Need (<u>youthinneed.org</u>) for the **2025 Giving Tree**. Holy Cross will sponsor 44 youth this year and bless them with some gifts this Christmas. MOTQ: Currently, the Missions and Stewardship Boards are supporting Lutheran Early Response Team (LERT), a ministry program of the LCMS that trains volunteers to assist in times of disaster. These teams respond to both natural and man-made disasters by providing Christian care and assisting with cleanup, debris removal, and other essential services in affected communities. Several members of Holy Cross have attended LERT training in the past and have utilized the skills learned to support our community. All MOTQ donations from now through the beginning of 2026 will be used to help fund and support LERT projects.

OPPORTUNITY TO SERVE THE HOMELESS: Holy Cross has been approached by the Emergency Weather Response agency for St. Charles, Lincoln, and Warren Counties about our providing a place to sleep for homeless people on extremely cold evenings. Our sister congregation, Chapel of the Cross, has been doing this for several years. They are looking for volunteers to help at their church during the weeks of Jan. 11, Jan. 25, and Feb. 22. We encourage interested members from Holy Cross to sign up for a couple of nights for one week to watch how it works. It could provide a great way for us at Holy Cross to assist homeless people in the future. A person would work one shift on an evening with two other people. Direct Up to Half of Your Missouri Taxes to Lutheran Schools: Through a fairly simple process, you can send half of your taxes to the State of Missouri to support a student in a Lutheran school. This will not save you money but also will not cost you additional dollars. If your Missouri State Tax on Line 36 last year was \$1,000, you could have sent \$500 to support a student in a Lutheran school and the other \$500 to the State of Missouri. This program began in 2022. Since then, the Missouri District has awarded over \$5 million in scholarships, helping more than 900 students attend 45 Lutheran schools across Missouri. Many of these children are experiencing their first year in a Lutheran school—an opportunity made possible through MOScholars.
