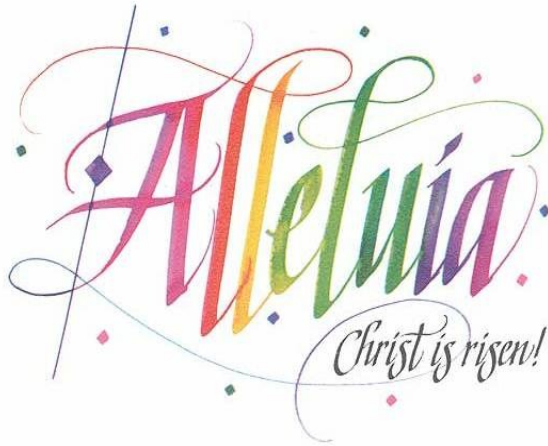
HOLY COMMUNION AT HOLY CROSS is celebrated in accordance with the Lutheran confession that Christ's body and blood are truly given to us with the bread and wine to give forgiveness of sins, life, and salvation to repentant, reconciled believers in Christ. Missouri Synod Lutherans united with us in that confession are invited to receive the Sacrament with us. Others who desire to commune should first speak with a Pastor or an Elder.

- For those whose health or circumstance may require it, Holy Cross offers an **alcohol-removed red wine** (containing less than 0.5% alcohol) located in the center of each Communion tray.
- **Gluten-free wafers** are available upon request to a Pastor or Elder before the service.
- If you want **communion in the pew**, please let an usher or Elder know before the service.

TODAY Holy Communion will be distributed in a continuous line at 9AM.

Pastors and Elders will stand in front of the Altar rail for you to receive the Lord's Supper. Both common and individual cup will be offered. Take the one you desire. A child with you will receive a word of blessing. If, after you receive communion, you desire to kneel at the Altar for a moment of prayer, please do so. The general Dismissal Blessing will follow after all have communed.

Peter opened his mouth and said: "Truly I understand that God shows no partiality, ³⁵but in every nation anyone who fears Him and does what is right is acceptable to Him. ³⁶As for the word that He sent to Israel, preaching good news of peace through Jesus Christ (He is Lord of all), ³⁷you yourselves know what happened throughout all Judea, beginning from Galilee after the baptism that John proclaimed: ³⁸how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power. He went about doing good and healing all who were oppressed by the devil, for God was with Him. ³⁹And we are witnesses of all that He did both in the country of the Jews and in Jerusalem. They put Him to death by hanging Him on a tree, ⁴⁰but God raised Him on the third day and made Him to appear, ⁴¹not to all the people but to us who had been chosen by God as witnesses, who ate and drank with Him after He rose from the dead. ⁴²And He commanded us to preach to the people and to testify that He is the one appointed by God to be judge of the living and the dead. ⁴³To Him all the prophets bear witness that everyone who believes in Him receives forgiveness of sins through His name."

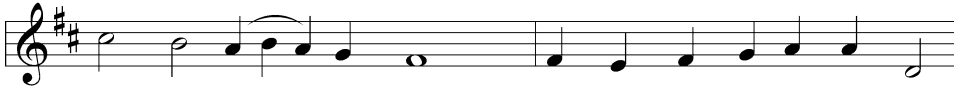

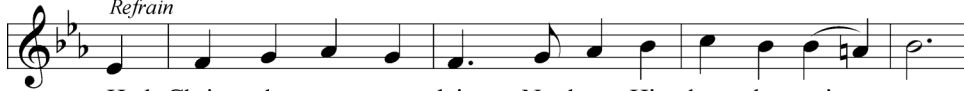
